OLD BUSINESS:

TARC 50th anniversary celebration, April 17, 2023. Planned program beyond the drawing a winner for the ICOM IC-7300, includes invitations to original (Tom W4DAX) and early

members of the club. Tom W4DAX will give a short presentation about the history of the club and announce the scholarship winner.

Mobile Ham Radio Station update: the Interior walls have been painted, exterior graphics have been applied and all interior furnishings were installed. Most of the electrical system components are on hand and ready for installation. Waiting for the inverter/charger, four 200 AH batteries and power pole distribution block to arrive. There is one quote for trailer theft and damage insurance that is being considered.

W4DAX Scholarship Program. Three scholarship applications were received; only one application complied with all requirements. A team of three club members (Jim KO4MNB, Jim KO4PGH and Pam KO4WWN) will review the applications before the March meeting and forward to Tom W4DAX the highest-ranking application. Tom W4DAX will present the first \$1000 scholarship award at our April 2023 meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

Summer Field Day (SFD), 24 and 25 June 2023. Jim KO4PGH has agreed to take the lead on organizing SFD. TW KF4CQH will assist Jim. The SFD rules have been published by ARRL. We will operate two stations for the event. Setup will be Saturday morning, on the air at 1400 EDT until around noon on Sunday. The location will be the open field just past Glenn Stephens house will be the field day site. Watch for opportunities to sign up; we need folks to set-up, operate/log and take down.

The board members discussed the possibility to change status from IRS 501(c)(4) to 501(c)(3). The club will not change to an IRS 501(c)(3) at this point in time. If a grant opportunity arises, a small group can form an IRS 501(c)(3) for the sole purpose of applying for grants.

Properties needs a new chairperson; the assistant has taken over as Programs chair. As we acquire the trailer and new equipment this will become an important role within the club.

STEM Education Day during week long camp in June. The organizer has mentioned June 21 or 23 for us to setup the MHRS. We will set up operations similar to the event at the Citadel; this time with the new trailer. Several folks will be needed to setup antennas and run radios for this event.

Jim KO4MNB and Steve K4OPZ were invited by St. John Catholic School in North Charleston to give a presentation amateur radio and STEM. This would be part of our outreach to underserved communities in the area. The program was well received and the school would like us to bring the MHRS out during May.
